WHO DONE IT?



Back by popular demand, Saturday School is offering 'Mystery Festival- Who Done It?' So put on your Sherlock hat and spend an exciting week at GSU solving mysteries! Check out the "Crime Scene" and conduct many hands-on forensic science tests which lead you to the solution. Sort through all the evidence, use your critical thinking skills, and have a blast sleuthing your way through our very own CSI!

Grades: K-3: Who Took Mr. Bear?



Everybody loves a mystery. You'll also love to solve this make-believe mystery by investigating, exploring, and performing experiments. In an effort to discover who 'took' a stuffed animal called Mr. Bear, student-detectives conduct many hands-on forensic science tests on evidence found at a "crime scene" so they can determine who are the likely suspects, what is the difference between hard evidence and inference, and finally discover who the culprit was who "took" Mr. Bear. Students create a Clue Board to organize all the information they gather

while learning important science skills and concepts.

Grades: 4-8: The Mystery of Felix- The Case of the Missing Millionaire



This Mystery Festival unit is designed to have students act as crime lab scientists to help solve an imaginary mystery. In an effort to discover which fictional suspect (or suspects) may have committed a "crime" at Felix's beach house, the class will examine a large variety of clues from a "crime scene" and perform forensic tests on evidence while learning important science skills and concepts. Student sleuths practice making the distinction between evidence and inference in writing their own detective report or news report. By contrast, the "Suspect Talks" writing

allows students to be creative and write as though their inferences are true – not only about what may have happened but also the motivations involved.
